Welcome to the Tribal Administrator's Office!

Tribal Administrator, Mel Tafoya - The Tribal Administrator, TA, oversees most of the tribal programs within the Administration and works closely with the Governor's Office. The TA is assisted by two Deputy Tribal Administrators, Gilbert and Dennis, who share these duties as well. Mel oversees the two Deputy Tribal Administrators as well as the following Departments: Environmental, Human Resources, Tribal Courts, Accounting, Forestry, Intergovernmental & Public Relations, Realty, Rights Protection, Self- Governance, Special Projects, Sanitation, Transportation, and the Office of Emergency Management. Mel has been working for SCP for over 36 years, and volunteers as the Fire Chief and is also a licensed Emergency Medical Technician. Mel serves as the Southwest Region Board of Directors with the Intertribal Agriculture Council and is a member of the Tribal Expert Working Group with the Center for Disease Control on post Covid Response.

Deputy Tribal Administrator, Gilbert Tafoya – Duties of the Deputy Tribal Administrator, DTA, are to assist the TA with daily responsibilities. His role changed a few months ago and he now reviews programmatic functions of all the programs. As a former Governor, Gilbert brings his awareness of past tribal history and knowledge. DTA Gilbert currently oversees the following programs: Adult Day Center, Senior Center, CHR/ Diabetes, Social Services, Behavior Health, Vital Statistics/Enrollment, Information Technology, Custodial/Maintenance, and the Office Manager.

Deputy Tribal Administrator, Dennis Silva – Duties of the Deputy Tribal Administrator are to assist the TA with daily responsibilities. His role has also changed and now DTA Dennis oversees the financial functions of and the programs. Dennis is a past Tribal Council member with years of past experience as the Director of the Social Services and Behavioral Health Programs. DTA Dennis currently oversees the following programs: Adult Education, JOM, Head Start, Library, Recreation/ Department of Youth & Learning (DYL), RezRiders, Tewa Language, & Victim Services.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER

Failure to Correct Significant Deficiencies

The Santa Clara Pueblo Public Water System (PWS ID 063500166) failed to correct significant deficiencies identified during a sanitary survey within the timeline required by the Safe Drinking Water Act. This resulted in a violation of the Ground Water Rule. Even though this was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we did to correct this situation.

What happened?

On December 14, 2016 EPA Region 6 Drinking Water Staff performed a detailed evaluation of the water system, called a sanitary survey. From these surveys, the EPA identified significant deficiencies with the water system's facilities, operations and management. Some of these deficiencies remained unaddressed from previous deadlines for correction.

What should I do?

- There is nothing you need to do at this time. You do not need to boil your water or take other actions
- You may continue to drink the water. If a situation arises where the water is no longer safe to drink, you will be notified within 24 hours.

What does this mean?

This is not an emergency. If it had been, you would have been notified within 24 hours. But as our customer, you have a right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct this situation. Inadequately treated or inadequately protected water may contain disease-causing organisms. These organisms can cause symptoms such as diarrhea, nausea, cramps, and associated headaches. However, these symptoms are not only caused by organisms in drinking water, but also by other factors. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice.

What is being done? These deficiencies are being worked on to correct all of them by the next couple of years. Due to lead times on parts. 
Vaccinate and protect our history and future

In New Mexico, eligible voters have the convenience of **same day voter registration**. This allows individuals to register or update their registration and vote on the same day at their County Clerk's Office or at designated polling locations during Early Voting and on Election Day for 18 and older U.S. citizens. In order to register as a new voter or update your registration, your personal information **must match** the information that is on file with the New Mexico Motor Vehicle Division (MVD). These are the things that **must match**: Your social security number, Your driver's license number or state identification number, and Your date of birth. https://www.sos.state.nm.us

ABSENTEE BALLOTS can be hand delivered and dropped off, in person, or by a relative to the Election Presiding Judge during Early Voting and on Election Day at this voting site. If you mail your ballot back, but it still has not been received by Election Day, you still have the option to go to a polling place and cast a ballot. You will need to sign an affidavit canceling the mailed ballot you submitted. N.M. NATIVE VOTING QUICK FACTS

When did native people become eligible to vote?

Native Americans born in the U.S. were granted Full **citizenship** in that country according to the **Snyder Act** of **1924**. Although the **Fifteenth Amendment**, established in **1870**, gave all residents of the United States the right to **vote**, regardless of race, **Native Americans** were not able to take advantage of these **rights** until the **Snyder** Act.

The right to vote has been an uphill battle for Native Americans. The Voting Rights Act of 1965 helped to secure and protect that right for many Native Americans.

Santa Clara Pueblo Tribal Council have implemented physical address locations for each building in the community. All elections will be accessible by all voters utilizing the state's absentee ballot applications and mailing in the absentee ballots. New Mexico's 23 Tribes, Nations and Pueblos make up 11% of our state's population.

Only 2% of the U.S. population is made up of Natives Americans.

From the 2016 primary to the 2020 primary, voter turnout on Native American precincts in New Mexico dropped by nearly 1 percent.

There are more than 81 other court cases that have been litigated since 1965 over instances of dilution, discrimination against or intentional disenfranchisement of Native American voters.

Native peoples play a crucial role in local, state, and national elections, with the Native vote being pivotal in determining the outcome of the 2020 presidential election. Voting gives Indian Country a voice in policies and issues that impact our communities, including those related to the environment, health care, the economy, and education. Voting is also a way we can protect tribal sovereignty and our Indigenous rights, which can be threatened or strengthened by the outcome of a federal election.



Miguel Trujillo Sr. of Isleta Pueblo, attempted to register to vote but was denied based on a 1912 provision of the New Mexico constitution. He sued the state and was allowed to vote after a judicial decision on August 3, 1948. Native Americans were not given the full right to vote in New Mexico until 1962, the last state to do so in the nation. Since then the State of New Mexico has delivered meaningful election changes making it easier and more accessible for NM Native Americans.
